## Board of Inquiry into the COVID-19 Hotel Quarantine Program Our client: Chief Commissioner of Police (CCP)

We refer to your letter dated 8 October 2020.

In order to ensure that all potentially relevant information will be available to the Board, Victoria Police has conducted exhaustive enquiries and searches for the purposes of the preparation of its and former CCP Ashton's responses to each of the Board's notices to produce.

On that basis, we are instructed to respond to the Board's questions as follows:

1 (i) Does any relevant police member know who made the decision to engage private security contractors in the hotel quarantine program?

No.

(ii) If so, please provide all relevant details including who holds that knowledge, how they came to be in possession of that knowledge, who made the decision to engage private security contractors and the circumstances in which that decision came to be made.

Not applicable.

(iii) If not, please provide any information that may assist the Board in determining who made the decision to engage private security contractors in the hotel quarantine program.

Victoria Police has no such information to provide.

(iv) Does any relevant police member know who contacted or may have contacted Mr Ashton between 1:16pm and 1:32pm on 27 March 2020?

If so:

- 1. who made that contact or may have made that contact; and
- 2. what was said or may have been said?

No, other than what has been disclosed in the media today.

- Copies of any correspondence with Telstra relating to the request for Mr Ashton's incoming telephone records or, if such documents do not exist, the following information to be included in the abovementioned letter:
  - (a) How, when, by whom and in what terms was the request made of Telstra?
  - (b) How, when, by whom and in what terms was the response from Telstra provided?

Victoria Police made verbal requests to Telstra. On 1 September 2020, a Victoria Police lawyer contacted Telstra's law enforcement section to request records for the mobile phone used by former CCP Ashton as of 27 March 2020. The lawyer was informed at that time that Telstra could not provide those records to Victoria Police other than for the purposes of an investigation of an offence. Victoria Police understands that this information was referable to sections 178 to 180 of the Telecommunications (Interception and Access) Act 1979.

Also on 1 September 2020, a manager in Victoria Police's Business Support team contacted Telstra's Telecommunications and Purchasing and Management Strategy Client Services Help Desk by phone and asked what data would be available via billing transactions. The manager was advised that no numbers external to Victoria Police would be available via billing data due to relevant legislation.



Finally, we note Ms Ellyard's confirmation that production of documents of the nature listed above was not required by any NTP previously served on the CCP.






